Obrazloženje teme	

Naziv disertacije "Rodna ravnopravnost: Međunarodno - pravni temelji ženskih prava, sa posebnim osvrtom na Crnu Goru" upućuje na analizu ravnopravnosti polova sa aspekta dva referentna pravna okvira - međunarodnog i domaćeg, kao i na evaluaciju implemetacije relevantnih međunarodnih standarda u crnogorski pravni sistem.

Neravnopravnost polova kao društveni problem, star koliko i samo društvo, proizašao je iz osnova socijalne strukture koja favorizuje patrijarhat i borbu za moć i nadmoć nad slabijima. Ovaj društveni problem dugo vremena nije ozbiljno shvatan i proučavan, jer se smatralo da ne predstavlja društveno značajno pitanje. U društvenim okruženjima sa jakim uticajem patrijarhalnog nasljeđa, kakvo je i naše, neravnopravnost polova i diskriminacija po osnovu pola se teško prepoznaju kao važan društveni problem. Analiza društveno – istorijskih okvira u Crnoj Gori pokazuje da do nedavno neravnopravnost polova, diskriminacija po osnovu pola i nasilje prema ženama nisu bili shvaćeni kao društveni problem koji treba rješavati i koji kao takav zauzima važno mjesto u stvaranju dobrih uslova za cjelokupan napredak društva. Crnogorska sredina je pretežno patrijarhalna u kojoj vladaju stereotipi o rodnim ulogama. Patrijarhalni i kulturni obrasci ponašanja ukorijenjeni na našim prostorima direktno izražavaju autoritet muškaraca nad ženama. Ovi kulturni obrasci potkrepljuju se učenjem tradicionalnih polnih uloga još u ranom djetinjstvu, pa se autoritet muškarca nad ženom reprodukuje i na potomstvo. Stereotipi o rodnim ulogama, siromaštvo, ekonomska i socijalna kriza i naravno patrijarhalno nasleđe, stvorili su pogodnu klimu za uspostavljanje neravnopravnosti polova koje se zadržalo i do danas. Još uvijek u našoj kulturi postoje predrasude o položaju žene i njihovom položaju u porodici i društvu, te nejednak tretman muškaraca i žene u mnogim sferama crnogorskog društva.

Neravnopravnost polova i diskriminacija po osnovu pola predstavlja složeni izazov savremenog društva. Društvene i kulturološke pretpostavke i uslovi doprinijeli su tome da je ono dugo godina bio opšteprihvaćen standard. Razvojem društva i unaprjeđivanjem standarda iz ove oblasti na međunarodnom nivou, neravnopravnost polova i diskriminacija po osnovu pola kao društvena konstanta prepoznato je kao značajan problem koji treba rješavati, a njegove negativne posljedice suzbijati i sprječavati. Postizanje ravnopravnosti polova postalo je predmet društvenih rasprava, naučnih istraživanja, briga brojnih društvenih i državnih institucija, a naročito institucija na međunarodnom nivou koje su isto prepoznale kao jedan od važnih segmenata bogatog korpusa ljudskih prava. U novije vrijeme, pod jakim pritiskom ženskih pokreta ističe se mnoštvo zahtjeva za drugačijim pristupom pri rješavanju ovog problema.

Ključne instance kada je u pitanju ravnopravnost polova i diskriminacija po osnovu pola su međunarodne organizacije koje su stvorile jak pravni okvir sačinjen od velikog broja međunarodnih dokumenata i preporuka. Evolucija društvenog odnosa prema ravnopravnosti polova je uslovlila značajne promjene u segmentnu pozitivno – pravne regulative.

Tako je Crna Gora posljednjih godina posvetila značajnu pažnju postizanju ravnopravnosti polova, posebno kroz uspostavljanje adekvatnog pravnog okvira, te je preduzela značajne korake ka poboljšanju nacionalnog pravnog okvira kada je u pitanju predmetna oblast. Sa tim u vezi, ova disertacija ima za cilj da analizira primjenu relevantnih međunarodnih standarda iz ove oblasti i da napravi komparaciju u odnosu na uporedne pravne sisteme i crnogorski pravni sistem.

Crna Gora se suočava sa dvostrukim izazovom. Sa jedne strane, izazov predstavlja utemljenje dobrog pravnog okvira i institucionalnih mehanizama u cilju postizanja rodne ravnopravnosti, a sa druge strane, još se većim izazovim čini postojanje nedovoljno razvijene svijesti crnogorskog društva o predmetnoj tematici. Premda su neke zemlje uređenije i moglo bi se reći da su dostigle visok nivo ravnopravnosti polova, generalno govoreći, ravnopravnost polova i diskriminacija po osnovu pola su problemi svjetskih razmjera koji prevazilazi granice društva, kultura, rasa i religija. Njegove posljedice su dalekosežne. Zato je sagledavanje ove teme kako sa međunarodnog tako i nacionalnog aspekta od velikog značaja jer na taj način rad pruža jedan sveobuhvatan uvid o ovu temu.

Pregled istraživanja

Predmet istraživanja jeste međunarodni i nacionalni pravni okvir ravnopravnosti polova, komparativna analiza difuzije i razvoja instituta ravnopravnosti polova kako na međunarodnom tako i na nacionalnom planu, sa posebnim akcentom na procese prilagodavanja Crne Gore međunarodno preduzetim obavezama i evropskim integracionim tokovima. U centru disertacije nalazi se evaluacija primjene međunarodnih standarda iz predmetne oblasti u Crnoj Gori, te davanje pregleda implementacije istih i analiziranje stanja u crnogorskom pravnom sistemu.

Pored toga, posebno će biti naglašeni primjeri dobre i loše prakse u implementaciji pomenutih normi, a sve to u cilju efikasnog postizanja standarda ravnopravnosti polova. Ova disertacija će kao takva pružiti informacije o tome koliko daleko je crnogorski pravni sistem odmakao kada je u pitanju ova oblast, daće se istorijski osvrt, izvršiće se komparacija sa drugim pravnim sistemima ali i analiza primjene međunarodnih standarda iz ove oblasti. Poseban osvrt biće dat na sudsku praksu i relevantna istraživanja iz ove oblasti.

Radi što boljeg sagledavanja i razumjevanja predmetnog istraživanja, disertacija će biti podijeljena na nekoliko cjelina, pri čemu će svaka od cjelina imati svoje značajne podcjeline. Osim uvoda, u kojem će se objasniti metodološki pristup, društvena i pravna priroda problematike, kao i hipoteze naučnog istraživanja, disertacija će biti okvirno sačinjena od sedam poglavlja i zaključnih ocjena.

Prvo poglavlje rada nosiće naziv "Teorijsko - pojmovni okvir: Osnove ravnopravnosti polova" što ukazuje na teorijsko - metodološki pristup, kroz opisivanje teorija i osnovnih pojmova koji su važni u okviru istraživanja. Osnovni pojmovi biće izloženi jezgrovito, jer su oni u znatnoj mjeri analizirani u radovima naših i stranih teoretičara u ranijem periodu. Na opisnom nivou u radu, analiza će biti usmjerena na deskripciju i određivanje osnovnih teorijskih pojmova kao baze za bolje razumjevanje cjelokupnog rada, kao što su- feminizam, feministička teorija, pol i rod, ravnopravnost između polova, polna diskriminacija i slično.

Drugo poglavlje "Istorijski okvir: Razvoj ženskih prava kao značajan dio korpusa ljudskih prava" predstavlja osvrt na razvoj ženskih prava u svijetu i kod nas. U okviru ovog dijela ukazaće se na činjenice koje su važne za istoriju feminizma i na društvene promjene koje su uticale na položaj žena. U okviru ovog poglavlja biće obrađene dvije značajne cjeline. Prva cjelina odnosi se na međunarodni kontekst difuzije ravnopravnosti polova kroz osvrt na razvoj feminizma u svijetu, razvoj međunarodnog prava, androcentrizam međunarodnog prava i ljudskih prava, biće govora i o "univerzalnim pravima", rodnoj ravnopravnosti i muškom standardu u međunarodnom pravu, kao i o borbi za jednak tretman žena i nastanku ženskih prava uopšte. Druga cjelina odnosi se na domaći kontekst difuzije ravnopravnosti polova kroz prikazivanje razvoja feminizma i ravnopravnosti polova na prostoru Balkana i Crne Gore, kao i pravni i ustavni razvoj ravnopravnosti između muškaraca i žena u Crnoj Gori, političkoj zastupljenosti žena, rodno zasnovanoj diskriminaciji i nasilju, kao i ekonomskom aspektu rodne ravnopravnosti.

Treće poglavlje nosiće naziv "Međunarodno - pravni okvir: Ženska prava i međunarodni sistem zaštite ljudskih prava", u kojem će pažnja biti posvećena relevantnim međunarodnim dokumentima i preporukama iz ove oblasti. Pažnja će biti posvećena međunarodnim standardima utvrđenim i donijetim na tri nivoa: nivo Ujedinjenih nacija, nivo Savjeta Evrope i nivo Evropske unije. U tom smislu, u okviru ovog poglavlja postojaće nekoliko cjelina, prva, koja će se odnositi na međunarodne dokumente i standarde o pravima žena, u prvom redu na ženska prava i Ujedinjene nacije, a potom i druga, koja će se odnositi na regionalne dokumente i standarde koji se odnose na ženska prava a koji su donijeti pod okriljem Savjeta Evrope i Evropske unije, ali i institucionalni okvir zaštite ljudskih prava kroz rad međunarodnih organizacija i nevladinog sektora.

Četvrto poglavlje "Komparativni okvir: Ženska prava u uporednim - pravnim sistemima" ukazuje na primjenu komparativnog metoda pomoću kojeg će se izvršiti uporedno - pravni prikaz najznačajnijih karakteristika različitih pravnih sistema kada su u pitanju ženska prava. Cilj ovog dijela rada jeste da se pruži bolji pregled i razumjevanje ove teme tako što će se prikazati različita ustavna i zakonska rješenja i izvršiti komparacija sa domaćim sistemom. Radi što boljeg sagledavanja predmeta istraživanja, komparativnim metodom biće obuhvaćene neke zemlje regiona (Srbija, Hrvatska), razvijene zemlje (Velika Britanija, SAD), kao i neke od zemlja trećeg svijeta (Indija, Afričke zemlje).

U petom poglavlju "Pozitivno - pravni okvir: Ženska prava u Crnoj Gori" će se detaljnije obraditi pozitivno - pravni aspekt ravnopravnosti polova, i to sa aspekta ustavno - pravnog i zakonodavno -pravnog okvira, pa će ovo poglavlje biti podijeljeno na četiri cjeline: ustavni okvir za postizanje rodne ravnopravnosti, zakonski okvir za postizanje rodne ravnopravnosti, plan aktivnosti za postizanje rodne ravnopravnost i institucionalni mehanizmi u tom cilju. Ustavni okvir za postizanje rodne ravnopravnosti odnosiće se na članove 8,9 i 10 Ustava Crne Gore, kao i na socijalno - ekonomska prava, posebnu zaštitu žena na radu, pravo trudnica na zdravstvenu zaštitu iz javnih prihoda, porodicu i brak, ravnopravnost supružnika u braku i posebnu zaštitu majke i djeteta. Zakonski okvir za postizanje rodne ravnopravnosti će biti detaljnije obrađen kroz različite zakonske propise koji se bave ovom problematikom, kao što su: Zakon o rodnoj ravnopravnosti, Zakon o zabrani diskriminacije, Zakon o zaštiti od nasilja u porodici, Zakon o zabrani zlostavljanja na radnom mjestu, Zakon o zaštitniku ljudskih prava, kao i drugi zakoni koji imaju antidiskriminacione norme. Kroz cjelinu institucionalnih mehanizama biće analiziran rad Skupštinskog odbora za rodnu ravnopravnost, Odjeljenja za poslove rodne ravnopravnosti pri Ministarstvu za ljudska prava, Zaštitnika za ljudska prava, kordinatora u organima, kao i lokalni mehanizmi koji se koristi za postizanje rodne ravnopravnosti.

Poglavlje šest "Empirijski okvir: Istraživanja o ženskim pravima" upućuje na to da će se u disertaciji, osim pregleda domaće legislative, dati i prikaz relevantnih istraživanja iz ove oblasti. Ova istraživanja će biti od posebnog značaja jer na teritoriji Crne Gore problematika ženskih prava, neravnopravnosti polova i diskriminacije po osnovu pola do nedavno nije bila predmet značajnijeg interesovanja i proučavanja. Sa tim u vezi, dugo nisu postojali pouzdani statistički podaci i raspoloživa saznanja o predmetnom istraživanju, pa se nije mogao utvrditi stvaran obim, dinamika, struktura i druge značajne karakteristike ovog problema. Zbog toga, neka od najznačajnijih istraživanja koja su sprovedena u poslednjem periodu će zauzeti svoje mjesto u ovoj disertaciji.

U sedmom poglavlju "Empirijski okvir: Sudska praksa o ženskim pravima" biće prikazana bogata praksa Evropskog suda za ljudska prava, sa posebnim osvrtom na sledeća prava: rodna diskriminacija i nejednakost, seksualno nasilje, prundna golotinja, prinudni ginekoloski pregled, nasilje u porodici, ropstvo, prinudni rad, trgovina ljudima i reproduktivna prava. U okviru ovog dijela kroz prikaz i analizu nekoliko presuda biće dat osvrt i na praksu nacionalnih sudova povodom pitanja ženskih prava.

Najzad, posljednja cjelina rada posvećena je zaključnim ocjenama u kojima će se na bazi analize prethodnih djelova rada izvršiti sublimacija i sinteza rada. Njima će biti sublimirana cjelina materije, ali ne na nivou deskripcije, već i kroz iznošenje prijedloga za unaprjeđenjem i poboljšanjem nacionalnog pravnog okvira iz oblasti ravnopravnosti polova.

Poglavlja će biti logično i koherentno sistematizovana, u svemu saglasna sa metodološkim zahtjevima izrade naučno – istraživačkog rada, a prikupljena građa biće potkrijepljena grafičkim i tabelarnim prikazima, kao i propratnim komentarima, čime će se heterogenost u instrumentima prikupljanja i obrade podataka dodatno poboljšati. Dobijeni rezultati biće originalni i zasnovani ne samo na bibliografskim referencama, već će biti i naučno fokusirani kroz kvalitativno – kvantitativne sadržajne elemente, analizu legislativnog okvira, uz autentičnu interpretaciju dobijenih podataka, čime će se doprinijeti naučnom pozicioniranju predmetne tematike.

Cilj i hipoteze

Zaštita ljudskih prava sa posebnim akcentom na ženska prava, neravnopravnost polova, diskriminaciju po osnovu pola i nasilje prema ženama su u novije vrijeme postale jedne od najznačajnijih tema kako na globalnom, tako i na nacionalnom nivou. Iz tog razloga ova disertacija teži da na sveobuhvatan način pristupi pravnoj analizi ovog problema kako sa aspekta međunarodnog prava, tako i sa aspekta analize nacionalne legislative.

Iz navedenog može se zaključiti da disertacija u svom temelju ima brojne **ciljeve**:

- prikazivanje ideje ravnopravnosti polova kao jednog od osnovnih ljudskih prava;
- ukazivanje na probleme diskriminacije i marginalizacije žena u javnoj i privatnoj sferi života;
- sagledavanje domaćih i međunarodnih standarda ravnopravnosti polova, kao i društvenog i pravnog položaja žene u svijetu i kod nas;
- izvršiti sistemsku analizu stanja u oblasti ravnopravnosti polova, pravne regulative, standarda ženskih prava;
- ukazivanje na postojeći pravni okvir, njegove pozitivne i negativne strane, posebno u svjetlu činjenice da se ne može govoriti o demokratskom društvu ako je iz samog procesa demokratizacije isključeno više od polovine društva;
- i sublimiranje i pružanje naučnih smjenica i doprinosa ka zaokruživanju odgovarajućeg pravnog okvira koji će zaista obezbijediti postizanje ravnopravnosti polova.

U crnogorskom društvu, ali i u svijetu, ravnopravnost polova još uvijek nije ostvarena iako je ravnopravnost polova i kao princip i pravo apsolutno neupitan i kao takav utemeljen u najvišim pravnim aktima na međunarodnom i nacionalnom nivou. Iako je mnogo urađeno na ispravljanju nejednakih i nepravednih uslova, generalno govoreći, žene u Crnoj Gori imaju manje mogućnosti, niži status i manje moći i uticaja od muškaraca. U istorijskoj retrospektivi, postavlja se pitanje stvarnog napretka pravnog okvira ka dostizanju standarda ravnopravnosti polova.

Sa tim u vezi, **hipoteza disertacije** glasi:

Crna Gora je napredovala u uspostavljanju pravnog okvira koji omogućava postizanje standarda rodne ravnopravnosti.

Prpratne hipoteze su:

- Crna Gora je harmonizovala svoj pravni okvir iz oblasti rodne ravnopravnosti sa relevantnim međunarodnim okvirom.
- Još uvijek postoji prostor i potreba za poboljšanjem crnogorskog pravnog sistema u postizanju rodne ravnopravnosti.
- Domaća legislativa koja reguliše pravne i institucionalne mehanizme za postizanje rodne ravnopravnosti je razumljiva, kompletna i realistična.

Imajući u obzir da je ova tema široka i iscrpljujuća, hipoteza će biti bazirana na nekoliko istraživačkih pitanja:

1. Da li i dalje postoji potreba za harmonizacijom domaćeg i međunarodnog pravnog okvira iz oblasti rodne ravnopravnosti?
2. Da li u domaćem pravnom sistemu postoje svi neophodni elementi za postizanje standarda rodne ravnopravnosti?
3. Da li je domaće zakonodavstvo koje uređuje oblast rodne ravnopravnosti razumljivo, kompletno i realistično?

Dakle, u disertaciji će se razmatrati normativne pretpostavke i stvarne mogućnosti za postizanje standarda ravnopravnosti polova. Kako bi se ispitale hipoteze i dao odgovor na istraživačka pitanja, izvršiće se analiza međunarodnog i nacionalnog okvira ravnopravnosti polova, kao i evaluacija primjene međunarodnih dokumenata i standarda iz predmetne oblasti u Crnoj Gori. Izvršiće se pregled implementacije međunarodnih standarda i izvršiće se analiza stanja u crnogorskom pravnom sistemu.

Materijali, metode i plan istraživanja

U cilju testiranja hipoteza, u disertaciji će biti korišćene uobičajene pravne metode koje se koriste u istraživačkom radu. U disertaciji će se koristiti normativno - dogmatički metod kao naučni metod saznanja pomoću kojeg će se obraditi lepeza relevantnih međunarodnih dokumenata i standarda iz predmetne oblasti i domaći pravni okvir kroz detaljnu analizu pozitivnih pravnih propisa kako u njihovoj cjelini, tako i u njihovim djelovima. Korišćenjem ovog metoda, uz korišćenje i sociološkog metoda biće uspostavljen teorijsko - metodološki pristup, kroz opisivanje teorija i osnovnih pojmova koji su važni u okviru istraživanja. Pomoću istorijskog metoda biće dat osvrt na predmetnu problematiku kako sa međunarodnog tako i sa domaćeg aspekta posebno u svijetlu prikaza difuzije i istorijskog razvoja ravnopravnosti polova. U disertaciji će se koristiti i komparativni metod na osnovu kojeg će se izvršiti uporedno - pravna analiza više pravnih sistema u pogledu predmetne oblasti. Koristiće se i metod deskripcije prilikom opisivanja i definisanja osnovnih pojmova i relevantnih pitanja za predmetnu oblast, kao i empirijski metod čime će se akcenat staviti na statističke podatke i tehnike, odnosno na relevantna istraživanja, ali i studije slučaja iz prakse Evropskog suda za ljudska prava i prakse crnogorskih sudova.

Osim navedenih uobičajenih pravnih metoda u disertaciji će se koristiti i brojni pomoćni metodi kako u pogledu strukturisanja sadržine materije, tako i u pogledu izvođenja konačnih sudova, odnosno zaključaka, kao što neki specifični metodološki pravni instrumentni: jezička analiza pravnih normi, autonomna analiza pravnih normi, ciljna analiza pravnih normi, analiza prakse domaćih sudova i Evropskog suda za ljudska prava, analiza vodeće pravne doktrine u međunarodnom i domaćem pravu, kao i analiza statističkih podataka, itd.

Korišćenje ovih metodoloških mehanizama ima za cilj sagledavanje međunarodnog i domaćeg pravnog okvira kao i relevantnih uporednih pravnih sistema, te zaključivanje koje bi se prednosti iz uporednih prava mogle integrisati u crnogorsko zakonodavstvo i da li je ono u potpunosti harmonizovano sa međunarodnim pravom koje po Ustavu Crne Gore uživa primat nad domaćim. Ovi metodi pružiće objektivni prikaz trenutnog stanja u obrađivanim pravnim sistemima po pitanju predmetne tematike.

Izvori na kojima će se oslanjati izrada disertacije, analiza i istraživanje predmetne tematike su prvenstveno relevantni međunarodni dokumenti i standardi iz ove oblasti, Ustav Crne Gore i zakonski akti koji se bave ovom problematikom kako bi se dao potpun uvid u sve izvore koji su operacionalizovani i koji bliže propisuju stvarni obim i sadržaj instituta ravnopravnosti polova. Disertacija će se oslanjati i na radovima domaćih i inostranih autora i teoretičara koji se bave relevantnim pitanjima za predmetnu problematiku, kao i na analizama, izvještajima i drugim relevantnim i dostupnim radovima značajnim za zaokruživanje teme disertacije.

Očekivani naučni doprinos

Više je razloga obrađivanja ove tematike, a jedan od glavnih jeste njen naučni doprinos. Aktualnost teme, ratovi na prostoru Balkana, veliki ekonomski problemi i siromaštvo, postojanje nacionalizma i nacionalističkih ideologija koje su dovele do zaborava nekih od temeljnih postupalata ostvarene emancipacije žena, pokretač su izrade ove disertacije. Sa naučnog aspekta, nedovoljno prisustvo predmetne tematike na polju društvenih, a posebno pravnih nauka predstavlja samo po sebi određeni doprinos nauci. U crnogorskoj pravnoj teoriji ovo pitanje nije dovoljno istraženo, a donedavno ova tematika nije privlačila posebnu pažnju. Aktuelni Ustav Crne Gore po prvi put u ustavnom razvitku eksplicitno garantuje ravnopravnost žene i muškaraca među svojim osnovnim načelima gdje obavezuje državu da vodi politiku jednakih mogućnosti.

Na prostoru Crne Gore ima neznatan broj radova koji se dijelom svoje materije odnose na predstavljenu temu, ili se odnose samo na njene pojedine aspekte, ali ne i na pravni aspekt, sa posebnim osvrtom na međunarodni. Imajući u vidu navedeno, rad će dati svoj doprinos u ovoj oblasti jer će na jedan sveobuhvatan način da evaluira nivo u kojem je Crna Gora napredovala u upostavljanju pravnog okruženja koji omogućava postizanje rodne ravnopravnosti, posebno u svijetlu primjene postojećih međunarodnih standarda iz predmetne oblasti.

Uprkos činjenici da je princip ravnopravnosti polova ugrađen u Ustav Crne Gore i zakone, evidentno je da diskriminacija po osnovu pola još uvijek postoji, da su ovom diskriminacijom nesrazmjerno pogođene žene i da ovaj princip i pravo nije uvijek ostvaren u praksi. U teorijskim razmatranjima i njegovom praktičnom djelovanju vrlo često dolazi do minimiziranja i marginalizacije pitanja ravnopravnosti polova. U Crnoj Gori problem nije u nedostatku zakonskih akata već u njihovom ignorisanju za šta su zasluženi gore pomenuti poremećeni odnosi, vrijednosni stavovi i ponašanja, kao i nepoznavanje suštine ovog instituta i njegove važnosti. Stoga, širenje svijesti i znanja o ravnopravnosti polova predstavlja vrlo važan segment djelovanja, a između ostalog i jedan od osnovnih ciljeva i zadataka ove disertacije.



Gender Equality: An international legal basis for women's rights with a special emphasis on Montenegro

Explanation of the topic

The title of the dissertation "*Gender Equality: An international legal basis for women's rights with a special emphasis on Montenegro*" refers to the analysis of gender equality from the aspect of two reference legal frameworks - international and domestic, as well as the evaluation of the implementation of relevant international standards in the Montenegrin legal system.

Gender inequality as a social problem, is as old as society itself, which arose from the foundations of a social structure that favors patriarchy and the struggle for power and supremacy over the weak. This social problem has not been taken seriously, and studied for a long time, because it was considered not to be a socially significant issue. In environments with a strong influence of patriarchal heritage, such as ours, gender inequality and gender discrimination are difficult to recognize as an important social problem. The analysis of socio-historical frameworks in Montenegro shows that until recently, gender inequality, gender discrimination and violence against women were not understood as a social problem to be addressed and as such occupies an important place in creating good conditions for overall progress of society. The Montenegrin environment is predominantly patriarchal, with stereotypes about gender roles. The patriarchal and cultural patterns of behavior rooted in our region directly express the authority of men over women. These cultural patterns are supported by learning traditional gender roles in early childhood, so the authority of a man over a woman is reproduced in the offspring. Stereotypes about gender roles, poverty, economic and social crisis and, of course, the patriarchal heritage, have created a favorable climate for the establishment of gender inequality, which has persisted to this day. There are still prejudices in our culture about the position of women and their position in the family and society, and unequal treatment of men and women in many spheres of Montenegrin society.

Gender inequality and gender discrimination is a complex challenge in modern society. Social and cultural assumptions and conditions have contributed to it being a generally accepted standard for many years. With the development of society and the improvement of standards in this area at the international level, gender inequality and gender discrimination as a social constant has been recognized as a significant problem to be addressed, and its negative consequences to be suppressed and prevented. Achieving gender equality has become a subject of social debates, scientific research, the concerns of numerous social and state institutions, and especially institutions at the international level that have also recognized it as one of the important segments of the rich corpus of human rights. In recent times, under strong pressure from women's movements, a multitude of demands for a different approach in solving this problem have emerged.

The key instances when it comes to gender equality and gender discrimination are international organizations that have created a strong legal framework composed of a large number of international documents and recommendations. The evolution of the social attitude towards gender equality has conditioned significant changes in the segment of positive legal regulations.

Thus, in recent years, Montenegro has paid significant attention to achieving gender equality, especially through the establishment of an adequate legal framework, and has taken significant steps to improve the national legal framework in this area. In this regard, this dissertation aims to analyze the application of relevant international standards in this area and to make a comparison with comparative legal systems and the Montenegrin legal system.

Montenegro faces a double faced challenge. On the one hand, the challenge is to establish a good legal framework and institutional mechanisms in order to achieve gender equality, and on the other hand, the existence of insufficiently developed awareness of Montenegrin society on the subject seems even more challenging. Although some countries are more orderly and could be said to have reached a higher level of gender equality, generally speaking, gender equality and gender discrimination are global problems that transcend the boundaries of society, cultures, races and religions. Its consequences are far-reaching. That is why the consideration of this topic from both the international and national aspect is of great importance, because in that way the work provides a comprehensive insight on this topic.

Research overview

The subject of research is the international and national legal framework for gender equality, a comparative analysis of the diffusion and development of gender equality institutes both internationally and nationally, with special emphasis on the processes of adjustment of Montenegro to international obligations and European integration trends. The dissertation focuses on the evaluation of the application of international standards in the subject area in Montenegro, and gives an overview of their implementation and analysis of the situation in the Montenegrin legal system.

In addition, examples of good and bad practice in the implementation of the mentioned norms will be especially emphasized, all with the aim of efficiently achieving gender equality standards. As such, this dissertation will provide information on how far the Montenegrin legal system has come when it comes to this area, a historical overview will be given, a comparison with other legal systems will be made, as well as an analysis of the application of international standards on gender equality. Special attention will be given to case law and relevant research in this area.

In order to better understand and comprehend the subject of research, the dissertation will be divided into several units, each of which will have its own significant sub-units. In addition to the introduction, which will explain the methodological approach, the social and legal nature of the issue, as well as the hypotheses of scientific research, the dissertation will be roughly composed of seven chapters and concluding assessments.

The first chapter of the paper will be entitled "Theoretical - conceptual framework: Fundamentals of gender equality", which indicates the theoretical - methodological approach, through the description of theories and basic concepts that are important in the research. The basic concepts will be presented concisely, because they have been significantly analyzed in the works of our and foreign authors and theorists in the earlier period. At the descriptive level in the dissertation, the analysis will focus on the description and definition of basic theoretical concepts as a basis for a better understanding of the whole topic, such as feminism, feminist theory, gender, gender equality, gender discrimination etc.

The second chapter "Historical framework: The development of women's rights as a significant part of the human rights corpus" is a review of the development of women's rights in the world and in our country. This section will point out the facts that are important for the history of feminism and the social changes that have affected the position of women.

The third chapter will be entitled "International legal framework: Women's rights and the international system of human rights protection", in which attention will be paid to relevant international documents and recommendations in this area. Attention will be paid to international standards set and adopted at three levels: the level of the United Nations, the level of the Council of Europe and the level of the European Union.

Chapter four "Comparative framework: Women's rights in comparative legal systems" indicates the application of a comparative method by which a comparative - legal presentation of the most important characteristics of different legal systems when it comes to women's rights.

The fifth chapter "Positive - legal framework: Women's rights in Montenegro" will deal in more detail with the positive - legal aspect of gender equality, from the aspect of constitutional and legislative framework, so this chapter will be divided into four parts: constitutional framework for achieving gender equality, legal framework for achieving gender equality, action plan for achieving gender equality and institutional mechanisms to that end.

Chapter six "Empirical Framework: Research on Women's Rights" indicates that the dissertation, in addition to a review of domestic legislation, will provide an overview of relevant research in this area.

Chapter seven "Empirical Framework: Judicial Practice on Women's Rights" will present the rich case law of the European Court of Human Rights, with special reference to the following rights: gender discrimination and inequality, sexual violence, prudent nudity, forced gynecological examination, domestic violence, slavery, forced labor, human trafficking and reproductive rights. Also, through the review and analysis of several judgments, a review of the practice of national courts regarding the issue of women's rights will be given.

Finally, the last part of the paper is dedicated to the final assessments in which, based on the analysis of the previous parts of the paper, sublimation and synthesis of the paper will be performed. They will sublimate the whole matter, but not at the level of description, but also through the presentation of proposals for the improvement and enhancement of the national legal framework in the field of gender equality.

The chapters will be logically and coherently systematized, in accordance with the methodological requirements of scientific research, and the collected material will be supported by graphical and tabular representations, as well as accompanying comments, which will further improve the heterogeneity in data collection and processing instruments. The obtained results will be original and based not only on bibliographic references, but also on factually relevant consultations with all practical bearers and subjects of the resocialization process, scientifically focused through qualitative - quantitative content elements, analysis of the legislative framework, with authentic interpretation of the obtained data. scientific positioning of subject matter.

Aim and hypotheses

The protection of human rights with a special emphasis on women's rights, gender inequality, gender discrimination and violence against women have recently become one of the most important topics at both the global and national level. For that reason, this dissertation strives to approach the legal analysis of this problem in a comprehensive way, both from the aspect of international law and from the aspect of the analysis of national legislation.

From the above it can be concluded that the dissertation is based on numerous **goals**:

- presenting the idea of gender equality as one of the basic human rights;
- pointing out the problems of discrimination and marginalization of women in the public and private spheres of life;
- consideration of domestic and international standards of gender equality, as well as the social and legal position of women in the world and in our country;
- perform a systematic analysis of the situation in the field of gender equality, legal regulations, women's rights standards;
- pointing out the existing legal framework, its positive and negative sides, especially in the light of the fact that one cannot speak of a democratic society if more than half of the society is excluded from the democratization process itself;
- and the sublimation and provision of scientific guidelines and contributions to the completion of an appropriate legal framework that will truly ensure the achievement of gender equality.

In Montenegrin society, but also in the world, gender equality has not yet been achieved, although gender equality as a principle and as a law is absolutely unquestionable and as such established in the highest legal acts at the international and national level. Although much has been done to correct unequal and unfair conditions, generally speaking, women in Montenegro have fewer opportunities, lower status and less power and influence than men. In historical retrospect, the question of the real progress of the legal framework towards reaching the standard of gender equality is raised.

In this regard, **the main hypothesis of the dissertations** is:

Montenegro has made progress in establishing a legal framework that enables gender equality.

The **accompanying hypotheses**:

- Montenegro has harmonized its legal framework with international regulations in the field of gender equality.
- There is still room for improvement in achieving gender equality in Montenegrin legal system.
- Domestic legislation regulating issues of legal and institutional mechanisms of gender equality are comprehensive, complete and realistic.

Given that this topic is broad, hypotheses will be based on several research questions:

- Is there a need for further harmonization of the domestic legal framework with the international one?
- Are there all the necessary elements in the domestic legal framework to achieve the standard of gender equality?
- Is domestic legislation regulating issues of legal and institutional mechanisms of gender equality comprehensive, complete and realistic?

Thus, the dissertation will consider normative assumptions and real possibilities for achieving gender equality standards. In order to test hypotheses and answer the research questions, an analysis of the international and national framework of gender equality will be performed, as well as an evaluation of the application of international documents and standards in the subject area in Montenegro. A review of the implementation of international standards will be performed and an analysis of the situation in the Montenegrin legal system will be performed as well.

Materials, methods and research plan

In order to test hypotheses, the dissertation will use the usual legal methods used in research work. The dissertation will use the normative - dogmatic method as a scientific method of knowledge which will deal with a range of relevant international documents and standards in the subject area and the domestic legal framework through a detailed analysis of positive legal regulations in their entirety and in their parts. Using this method, along with the use of the sociological method, a theoretical - methodological approach will be established, through the description of theories and basic concepts that are important within the research. Using the historical method, a historical review will be given to the subject issues from both the international and domestic aspect, especially in the light of the presentation of diffusion and the historical development of gender equality. The dissertation will also use a comparative method on the basis of which a comparative legal analysis of several legal systems in terms of the subject area will be performed. The method of description will be used when describing and defining basic concepts and relevant issues for the subject area, as well as the empirical method which will emphasize statistical data and techniques, ie relevant research, but also case studies from the case law of the European Court of Human Rights and practices of Montenegrin courts.

In addition to the above mentioned common legal methods, the dissertation will use a number of auxiliary methods both in terms of structuring the content of the matter, and in terms of derived final judgments, or conclusions, such as some specific methodological legal instruments: linguistic analysis of legal norms, autonomous analysis of legal norms, target analysis of legal norms, analysis of the practice of domestic courts and the European Court of Human Rights, analysis of the leading legal doctrine in international and domestic law, as well as analysis of statistical data, etc.

The use of these methodological mechanisms aims to review the international and domestic legal framework as well as relevant comparative legal systems, and to conclude which advantages of comparative legal systems could be integrated into Montenegrin legislation and whether is it fully harmonized with international law which under the Constitution of Montenegro enjoys primacy over domestic law. These methods will provide an objective view of the current situation in the legal systems under consideration on the subject matter.

The sources on which the dissertation, analysis and research of the subject will be based are primarily relevant international documents and standards in this field, the Constitution of Montenegro and legal acts dealing with this issue in order to give a full insight into all sources that are operationalized and which prescribe in more detail the actual scope and content of the institute of gender equality. The dissertation will also rely on the works of domestic and foreign authors and theorists dealing with relevant issues for the subject, as well as on analyzes, reports and other relevant and available works important for completing the topic of the dissertation.

Expected scientific contribution

There are several reasons for dealing with this topic, and one of the main ones is its scientific contribution. The topicality of the topic, wars in the Balkans, great economic problems and poverty, the existence of nationalism and nationalist ideologies that have led to the oblivion of some of the fundamental actions of the achieved emancipation of women, are the drivers of this dissertation. From the scientific aspect, the insufficient presence of the subject in the field of social, and especially legal sciences represents in itself a certain contribution to science. In Montenegrin legal theory, this issue has not been sufficiently researched, and until recently, this topic did not attract special attention. The current Constitution of Montenegro, for the first time in its constitutional development, explicitly guarantees the equality of men and women among its basic principles, where it obliges the state to pursue a policy of equal opportunities for both men and women.

In Montenegro, there is a small number of papers that relate in part to the presented topic, or relate only to some aspects of the topic, but not to the legal aspect, with special reference to the international. With this in mind, the paper will contribute in this area as it will comprehensively evaluate the level at which Montenegro has made progress in establishing a legal framework that enables gender equality, especially in light of the application of existing international documents and standards in this area.

Despite the fact that the principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Constitution of Montenegro and its laws, it is evident that discrimination based on gender still exists, that women are disproportionately affected by this discrimination and that this principle and right is not always realized in practice. In theoretical considerations and its practical operation, the issue of gender equality is very often minimized and marginalized. In Montenegro, the problem is not in the lack of legal acts, but in their ignoring, which is due to the above-mentioned disturbed relations, values and behaviors, as well as ignorance of the essence of this institute and its importance. Therefore, the dissemination of awareness and knowledge about gender equality is a very important segment of action, and among other things, one of the basic goals and objectives of this dissertation.
