### **BACKGROUND**

- European Commission Marie [Skłodowska] Curie Actions [M(S)CA] have been a key element of EU R&D policy across successive framework programmes
- MSCA Promotes / assists international mobility for researchers
- Estimated 100 000+ researchers have benefitted from M(S)CA
- Need to 'extend' benefits beyond the formal contractual M(S)CA experience by creating an association – the MCAA in 2013

Researchers at doctoral level (less than four years of full-time research experience and no doctoral degree)

Opened: 2 September 2014 Closes: 13 January 2015

at 17.00.00 Brussels time

Budget: € 370 million

#### What does it offer?

Opportunities to work on personal research projects by moving between countries and possibly sectors to acquire new skills

#### Who applies?

Individual researchers together with the host organisation

#### Who is funded?

Postdoctoral researchers

Opens: 12 March 2015 Closes: 10 September 2015 at 17,00,00 Brussels time

Budget: € 215 million

#### What does it offer?

The exchange of staff members involved in research and innovation to develop sustainable collaborative projects and the transfer of knowledge

#### Who applies?

International networks of research organisations from the academic and non-academic sectors

#### Who is funded?

Researchers, technical, administrative and managerial staff of any nationality and at all career levels

#### Call details:

Opens: 6 January 2015 Closes: 28 April 2015 at 17.00.00 Brussels time

Budget: € 80 million





### **MCAA Structure**








# Global Chapter Coverage







### WIDENING PARTICIPATION IN MSCA, SUNDAY 24<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2019

### **Session Description**

The interim evaluation of Horizon 2020 has provided insight into striking discrepancies between different participating countries and this gap affects excellent researchers that are still continuing to face intrinsic difficulties in participating in the programme. In the "Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation" document the Commission has identified these "low R&I performing" or "widening participation" countries and proposed different programs to bridge this gap.

The MCAA supports the process of "widening participation" of all EU countries within current and the next Horizon framework programme. In our panel discussion, with researchers coming from the "widening participation" countries, we will tackle the issues of different programs of "widening participation" and how they are affecting researcher from "widening countries". The aim of the discussion is to propose a set of recommendations to EU policymakers and national governments how to improve the current performance of the "widening countries".



### Widening Fellowships

Consider the **Widening Fellowships** applications to the call for **MSCA-IF**, where the host organisation is located in an eligible widening country, will be automatically resubmitted to this call in case their proposal fails to reach an adequate place in the ranking to be funded in the regular MSCA-IF call.

### Widening countries

**Member States**: Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia and Slovenia.

**Associated Countries**: Albania, Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, North Macedonia, Georgia, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Tunisia, Turkey and Ukraine.
