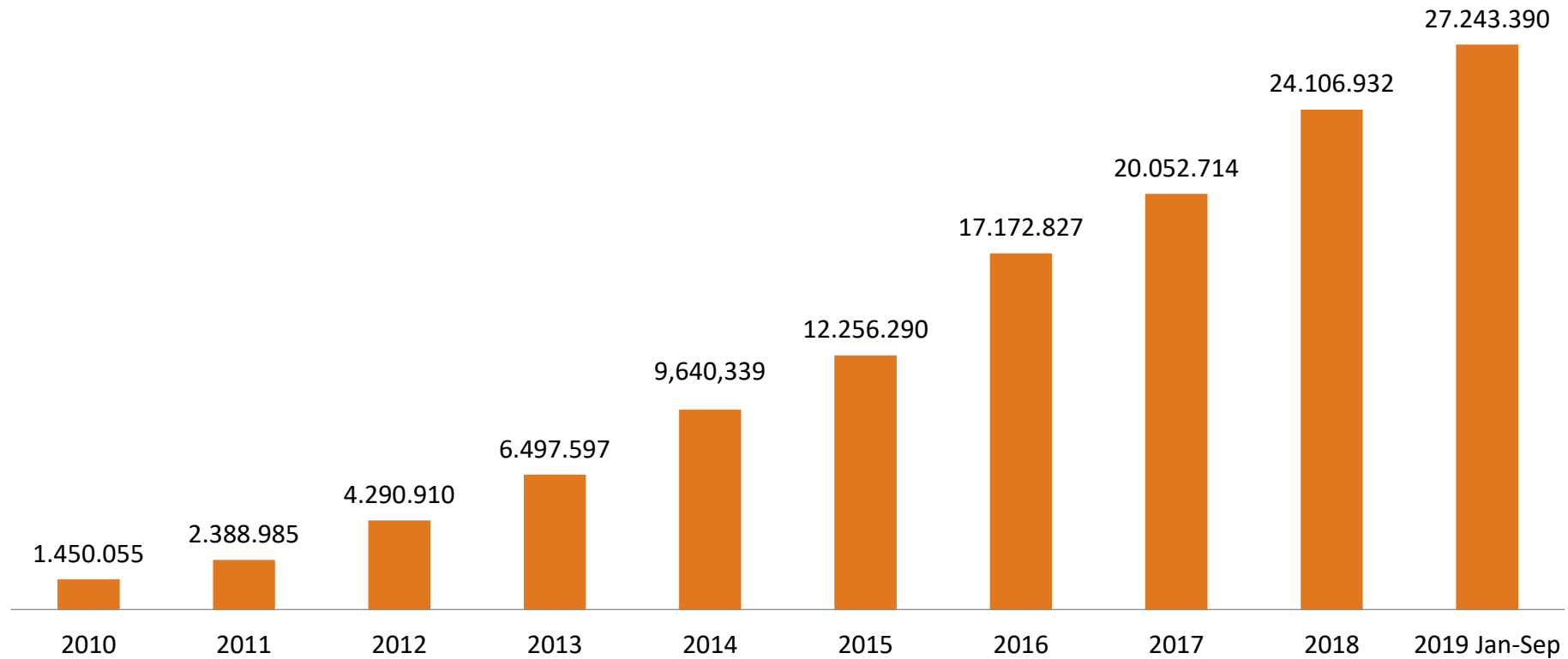

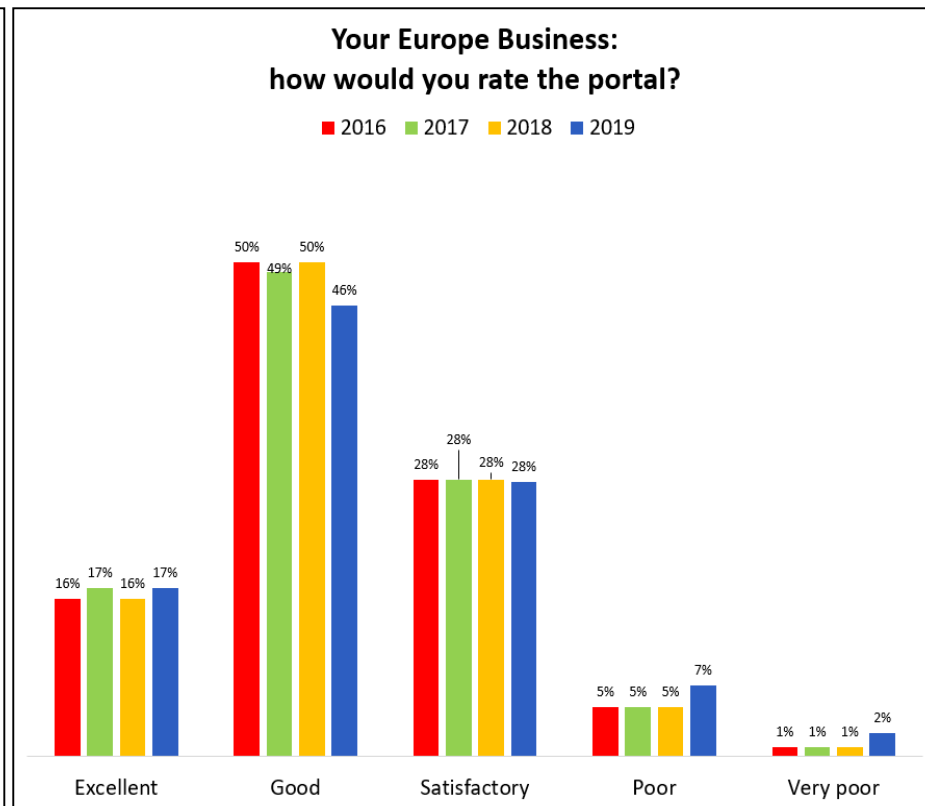
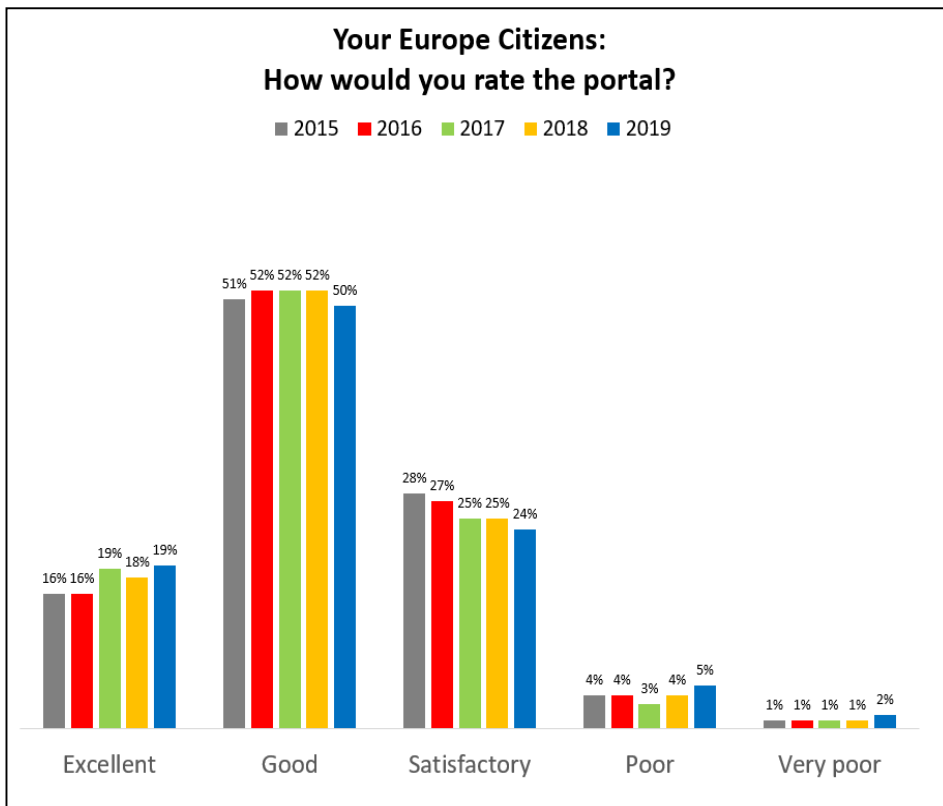

Registering your residence abroad

During the **first 3 months** of your stay in your new country, as EU national, **you cannot be required to apply for a residence document** confirming your right to live there - although in some countries you may have to [report your presence](#) upon arrival.

After 3 months in your new country, **you may be required to register** your residence with the relevant authority (often the town hall or local police station), and to be issued with a registration certificate.

You will need a **valid identity card or passport and:**

- **Employees / Postings abroad**
 - Certificate of employment or confirmation of recruitment from your employer

What is a regulated profession

As a general rule, a profession is regulated if you have to hold a specific degree to access the profession, sit special exams such as state exams and/or register with a professional body before you can practise it.

If your profession is regulated in the EU country where you want to practise, you may need to apply to get your professional qualification recognised there.

 Regulated professions differ across the EU. Check the [regulated professions database](#) to find out if your profession is regulated in the EU country you are moving to.

Check if you need to apply for **recognition of professional qualifications** and what **type of application** you need to submit.

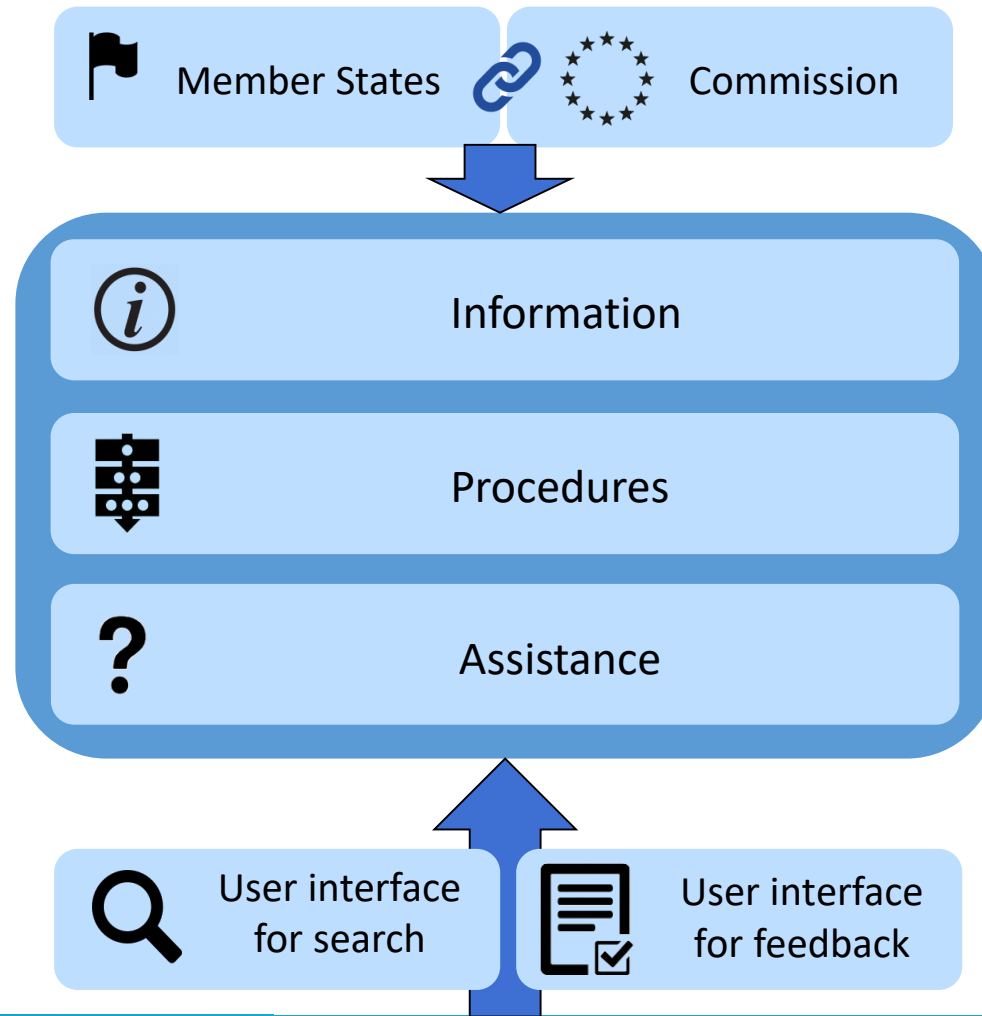
