

Coming to Ljubljana

By Air:

Ljubljana Jože Pučnik Airport (LJU): Located approximately 26 kilometres north of the city centre, this international airport serves numerous airlines and destinations. It offers regular flights to major European cities and is a convenient entry point for travellers. To reach Ljubljana from the airport, you can use a taxi, a bus or GoOpti. By Train:

• International Rail Services: Ljubljana's central railway station is a hub for international trains connecting to cities like Vienna, Zagreb, and Venice. The station is situated near the city centre, facilitating easy access to local transportation. More info: https://potniski.sz.si/en/
