CREDIT SYSTEM

Masaryk University works with a three-level study system and uses the ECTS credit system. The basic study unit is a course, which is given a certain number of credits per semester. The number of credits includes the number of hours of teaching time, as well as the student's work, which includes homework, consultations, writing essays, etc. The recommended study plans are conceptualised so as to allow the student to complete 60 ECTS credits per academic year, or 30 per semester.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The academic year at MU is made up of 2 semesters, autumn and spring. Both semesters have at least 12 teaching weeks (in the autumn semester normally from mid-September to the end of December and in the spring semester from mid-February to the end of May) and they are usually followed by a 6-week examination period.

ORGANISATION OF STUDIES

In order to graduate with a Bachelor's degree it is necessary to complete 180 ECTS credits, and 120 for the 2 year Master's degree. For the 3 year Master's degree students need to complete 300 ECTS credits (360 in the 6 year programme) and 240 in the 4 year doctoral degree.
