Examination metdods	Grading is structured within the scale 0-100% of the mastered material, while the passing grade will be achieved with the accumulation of 51% of the total material, as follows: Presentation – 5 points; Three tests – 45 points (all together); final exam -

Comment	Students who pass tests are free of that part of material for final exam.
