Student Mobility

The following basic requirements have to be considered for the participation in the program:

Students must

- have completed at least the first year of Bachelor when they start their study-abroad mobility
- remain registered at their home institution
- agree on a course of study for their period abroad before the start of the mobility, summarized in a Learning Agreement
- have sufficient language competence to follow the course of studies proposed; required language could be English (minimum level B1) or German (minimum B1), depending on the courses in question.



Student Mobility

Selection at the Home Universities

- Selection/Nomination of participants are defined by the sending University (International Offices of the Home University)
- Nominated students will receive all further information from the International Office/ERASMUS Office of Philipps-Universität Marburg

The selection of participants, as well as the procedure for awarding them a grant, must be fair, transparent and documented.

<u>Grant</u>

- Participants receive a mobility grant for the period of studies, as well as a lump sum for travel costs.
- The grant is as follows:
- Monthly grant of 800 EUR
- Travel Costs (lump sum)

Academic calendar for exchange students:

Fall/Winter:

- Beginning of September: Orientation programme for participants of pre-session language course and beginning of language course
- Beginning of October: Orientation programme for students <u>not</u> taking part in the pre-semester language course
- Mid-October mid-/end of February: Lecture time and exam period
- End of February mid-April: no lectures

Spring/Summer:

- Beginning of March: Orientation programme for participants of presemester language course and beginning of language course
- Beginning of April: Orientation programme for students <u>not</u> taking part in the pre-semester language course
- Mid-April mid-/end of July: Lecture time and exam period
- End of July mid-October: no lectures
